

Composition : Econazole Nitrate 1% & Triamcinolone Acetonide 0.1%.

Indications : For the topical treatment of inflammatory dermatomycoses and inflammatory skin conditions complicated by or threatened by bacterial or fungal skin infection.

Dosage and administration : The cream should be applied by gently rubbing into the skin twice daily for 14 days or as directed by the registered physician.

Side effects : Transient local mild irritation at the application site has been reported. Hypersensitivity has rarely been reported. Discontinuation of therapy usually results in cessation of the symptoms.

Contraindications : Like all preparations containing corticosteroids, Econazole Nitrate cream should not be used on tubercular skin infections or in viral diseases (e.g. herpes, vaccinia, varicella). Econazole Nitrate cream should not be administered to patients who have previously exhibited hypersensitivity to imidazoles or corticosteroids.

Use in pregnancy and lactation :

However, topical steroids should not be used extensively in pregnancy. Pregnancy Category : Econazole Nitrate-**C** & Triamcinolone Acetonide-**C**.

Packing : Dicot Cream: 10 gm in a tube.
